We've found the receptionist at the school's front desk is the best overseer of the IPM logbook. Students, teachers and other staff find it easy to report pests and PMPs have a central location to check the pest sighting log in this location. Adding an extra pest sighting log to the kitchen is also beneficial. We want to make sure every school gets logbooks, so please let us know if your school system has been left off this list and we'll make arrangements to get the books to you.
